What is ASSET?

The Agricultural Science Student Education Training (ASSET) programme is run by NIAB TAG and provides a valuable point of exchange with undergraduate students studying agronomy modules and their tutors at four leading crop science universities: Reading; Harper Adams; Newcastle and Nottingham.

The scheme is a mechanism through which NIAB TAG is able to:

- Support one outstanding final year student at each partner university to the sum of £3,000
- Promote career opportunities in the arable sector, crop sciences arena and at NIAB TAG.
- Present the work carried out by NIAB TAG.
- Maintain communications with key individuals teaching agronomic science in the UK.

Who can apply to the scheme and how does it work?

In order to be considered for the ASSET Award students must be registered to complete a specific crop based module in their second year as defined by each partner university. NIAB TAG staff visit each university to allow students to find out more about the organisation and its ASSET programme. Students then register their interest in participating in the programme with their course tutor who puts forward candidates to NIAB TAG staff.

The assessment procedures for the Award are tailored to fit in with the

curriculum at each university, but essentially the winners are selected each year based on the quality of specific second year project work, recommendation from their tutors and an interview with NIAB TAG staff. The four winners are usually announced at the end of the summer term and the bursaries presented in the autumn term of the third year.

What are the benefits of participating in the programme?

Participation in the programme serves to encourage students in their studies. We hope it also helps to inspire individuals to understand better how they might aim to make a difference to the UK agricultural industry in their future careers.

All participants are offered the opportunity to receive the NIAB TAG quarterly technical journal free of charge in their final year and for one year after graduation. They can also join a priority distribution list towards the end of their degree to be notified of all job vacancies with NIAB TAG.

In addition, winners receive a £3,000 bursary which is presented at a ceremony associated with a key technical event. All expenses are covered and the event is selected to be informative and relevant to the students' final year studies.

Other opportunities for students to interact with NIAB TAG or make linkages to other initiatives of potential benefit may arise on an ad hoc basis.
