



## BBSRC 4-year PhD Programme in Biosciences

## Applications are invited for studentships beginning in October 2013 Closing date: Tuesday 4<sup>th</sup> December 2012


The University of Cambridge, and several Partner Institutes in the region, together offer an unrivalled research environment in which to carry out PhD training. Up to 30 four-year studentships are available in a BBSRC-funded Doctoral Training Partnership (DTP) starting in October 2013.

Projects are available across the four broad themes of:

- Basic Bioscience Underpinning Health
- Bioenergy & Industrial Biotechnology
- Food Security
- World Class Underpinning Bioscience

The first year of the DTP PhD programme takes the form of an MRes, involving two laboratory rotations and a number of tailored training courses, followed by progression to a three-year PhD. An important element of the programme is a three month internship, where students gain experience in a non-academic background, such as in industry, the media, education or government.

The studentship will cover a stipend at the standard Research Council rate (£13,590 per annum for 2012-2013), research costs and tuition fees at the UK/EU rate, and is available for UK and EU students who meet the UK residency requirements. Students from EU countries who do not meet the residency requirements may still be eligible for a fees-only award.
